Programme description: *The SUSU Institute of Law Master's programme in Law and Digital Technologies provides students with advanced knowledge and practical skills in law, which is transforming due to digitalization. The programme is interdisciplinary, including subjects and courses in civil law, legal theory, state law, and criminal law. In addition, the programme allows students to learn about digitalization and its legal regulation in the international and comparative legal aspects. Lectures are read by leading Russian and international experts in the field.

The acquired knowledge will help the graduates of the programme earn leading positions in international legal and other companies or government agencies, whose activities are related to the legal aspects of the creation and application of digital technologies.
